
Welcome to the June 2024 Sports Services Newsletter






Wet Weather Communication Survey

Sports Field Floodlights

SMS Technology User Instructions


For sports fields that have floodlights operated by Illuminator SMS technology, hirers will be provided with a phone number and unique PIN code to activate the lights. To turn the lights ON or OFF, hirers must create an SMS text to the phone number provided, with the following message:

PIN Number > 'Switch Code' (1 = ON, 0 = OFF) > Field/Court Number > # (Refer graphic below for example)

Your PIN is to be kept secure as billing charges will be tracked to this PIN. For detailed instructions on how to operate the floodlight system, please refer to the <u>Club User Instructions</u>.

Important Reminders:

- There may be a warming/cooling down period of up to 15 minutes experienced during use, and users should communicate between each other to avoid sending consecutive / multiple commands to the system as this can cause system failures.
- Council are aware that floodlights are being left on, even whilst not in use, and relying on the timer to command the lights off. Council relies on user groups to be vigilant with the use of floodlights which helps to align with our good neighbour policy and climate strategy, and importantly avoids unnecessary charges.
- All floodlighting issues should be reported using Council's online reporting system. <u>Click here</u> to access the system, ensuring to select **Council Property Maintenance (inc signage)** from the category options.
