PUBLIC SPACE RECYCLING TRIAL

We're running a 12-month trial placing a limited number of public recycling bins throughout Sutherland Shire. From the last week in May you may see these in Gymea, Engadine, Sutherland, Sylvania and Woolooware shopping centres. Occasionally we'll move the bins to other locations, so we cover most suburbs during the trial.

Bins will be audited regularly, and we may make changes during the trial based on audit results.

All bins have a sign to show what can and can't go in. We encourage you to check before putting items in the new public place recycling bins.
